"For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them" Matthew 18:20



During Lent our attention is focused upon ourselves as we spend time reflecting on the question, "who we are as we come before God?" We do, indeed, "see through a glass dimly," as the apostle Paul wrote, and we may never see ourselves completely as God sees us. The psychologist Carl Jung believed that we each have, as part of our personality, both a dark and a bright shadow. He

used the word "shadow" to mean a part of ourselves of which we are usually unaware. The dark shadow represents those thoughts, behaviors, or traits that would get our disapproval if we were aware of them. The bright shadow represents those gifts, talents, or traits that not only would get our approval but might also be overwhelming, almost too bright for us to accept. Bright shadows often bring with them responsibilities and calls to service that we feel are too "high" for us to attain. God knows we are all a mixture of bright and dark, whether we are fully aware of it or not. Hopefully our reflections thus far have whetted our appetite to continue reflecting on the matter. But as Holy Week approaches, our attention turns toward someone else.

During Holy Week we focus attention on Jesus. We look at the events surrounding his final week on earth and must consider deep within our being the question he once asked the apostles: "Who do YOU say that I am?" As we see the events of that final week played out in our mind's eye, who is this man who is betrayed, arrested, horribly mistreated by his captors, tried before a judge without benefit of counsel – another's or his own, and then cruelly executed? The Gospel of John records what Jesus said about himself during his ministry: "I am the Good Shepherd" (10:14); "I am the resurrection" (11:25); "I am the way, the truth, and the life" (14:6); "I am the true vine" (15:1). But Jesus was silent during his own trial. How do we connect his words and his silence?

On Easter Sunday the focus of our attention shifts again. We see Jesus as the risen Christ. Not a Christ high above and far removed from life on this earth, but rather a Christ who continues to walk with his followers, a Christ who says, "And Lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Still the question echoes down through the ages: "Who do *YOU* say that I am?" How do <u>you word your</u> answer to Jesus' question? That answer is inextricably a part of our answer to the question we asked during Lent.

The disciples used their experience of Jesus to answer his question. They had walked with him, seen the things he did, and heard the words he spoke. They had eaten with him, slept with him, and lived daily with him. They had traveled around their corner of the world with him. We, no less than they, have recourse to our experiences of Jesus the Christ. And perhaps that is really what the question is all about: the way we experience the risen Christ; the way we see him living with us; the way we see ourselves walking with him in our lives; the way we experience his Spirit flowing into our spirit.

During Holy Week, spend some time with a journal and make some notes about your answer to Jesus' question, "Who do *you* say that I am?"



Gross, Bobby. Living the Christian Year: Time to Inhabit the Story of God. Downers Grove, IL: IVP Books, 2009. (List Price: \$18.00)

Need to give structure to your devotional reading during Lent? Both of the books listed above focus on the period of Lent and the remainder of the church year. Walter Brueggemann is an ordained United Church of Christ pastor who taught Old Testament for many years at Columbia Theological Seminary in Georgia. Brueggemann begins his Lenten section on page 81. Each reading starts with a series of Biblical reading for the day and a brief prayer. Most of the day's text consists of a brief passage (several paragraphs) written by Brueggemann citing several of the day's Biblical passages. The passages for Holy Week are attached to the end of the Lenten season.

Like Brueggemann Bobby Grossman follows the liturgical year. His section on Lent begins on page 125 of his book with a general introduction. Next, Gross, provides some brief remarks for an entire Lenten week. The events of Holy Week are found in a separate chapter focusing on the events beginning with Maundy Thursday through Holy Saturday.

If you are interested in a daily devotional, then use Brueggemann. However, if you want information on the Lenten season then you might want to add Grossman to your daily devotional.
